HB 3 (School Finance Reform)	Data Collection Items: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Extended Year for grades PK through 5th • Census Block • Serving Dyslexia Students • Dual Language • Career Technology grades 6th through 12th • Transportation costs for dual credit and CTE programs • Administration costs for college prep or certification exams • Gifted and Talented • Full-day Prekindergarten
SB 781/HB 1668	Relating to the regulation of residential treatment centers.
SB 1557	Relating to the definition of military-connected students, including providing a designation for certain school district campuses that take actions to assist those students.
HB 239	Relating to social work services in public schools. Update to Role ID and Service IDs.
HB 267	Relating to the attendance calculation for elementary grade levels. Grades Kindergarten through 5 th , ADA would be the final enrollment count for the year.
HB 314	Relating to use of compensatory education allotment funding to provide assistance to students at risk of dropping out of school who are pregnant or who are parents and reporting pregnancy as a Leaver Reason.
HB 55/SB 818	Relating to class size limits and student/teacher ratios for prekindergarten classes provided by or on behalf of public schools. (No data collection impact.)

HB 330	Relating to excluding certain students from the computation of dropout and completion rates for purposes of public school accountability. New Leaver Reason code for medical reasons.

HB 680/SB 1002	Relating to the evaluation of and improvements to the quality of the Texas Workforce Commission's subsidized child care program. (No data collection impact.)
HB 736	Relating to eliminating the requirement to use public school assessment instruments as a criterion for promotion or graduation or to make certain accountability determinations.
HB 569	Relating to the information required to be included in or with a school district ad valorem tax bill. (No data collection impact.)
HB 638	Relating to the issuance of posthumous high school diplomas to certain students. (No data collection impact.)
